



Spring/Summer 2022

NASUWT WORKPLACE REPRESENTATIVES

This two-day course will equip Workplace Representatives with the skills and knowledge required to undertake their role in the present educational climate. Subjects covered include an introduction to trade unionism, teachers' terms and conditions, the role and rights of NASUWT School Representatives, trade union organising, equality, and health and safety.

For Workplace Representatives considering caseworker status, completion of this course is an essential requirement.

REPRESENTATIVES: CASEWORK

This course focuses on skills essential in successfully handling the more complex problems that can come the way of Local Association Caseworkers. The course teaches how to deal with problems in a systematic manner; how to interview members; how to research documents and papers; and how to assemble a 'case'. There are opportunities to discuss issues with experienced tutors.

This course is part of the process of NASUWT casework accreditation and must be completed by members who want to undertake casework on behalf of the Union.

REPRESENTATIVES: NEGOTIATION

Negotiation is a skill central to the role of any trade union representative. This activity-based course teaches the theory and practice of negotiation in a structured, practical way. Research into successful negotiating strategies is drawn upon and will inform discussions and activities.

The course allows NASUWT members to practise and develop negotiating skills in a safe and supportive environment.

This course is NOT suitable for members in Northern Ireland.

DISCRIMINATION

This one-day course will equip caseworkers with practical skills and knowledge for identifying and tackling discrimination cases. The course will cover the Union's legal avenue for addressing discrimination casework, as well as provide an overview of discrimination law and how this should be applied in practice. It includes practical case studies on identifying the different strands of discrimination and the prohibited conduct to be applied in each case.

This is a course for members who want to become accredited NASUWT caseworkers and have already completed Workplace Representatives and Casework, or are about to complete Casework.

REDUNDANCY

This course for Local Association Caseworkers provides an update on the law relating to redundancy and enables the spreading of good casework practice. Other issues covered during the day are redundancy avoidance; redundancy procedures; and redundancy hearings. This is an opportunity for those handling redundancy situations to share experiences.

HEALTH & SAFETY STAGE 1

The NASUWT Health and Safety Representative in schools is an essential part of the NASUWT team, working to improve the lives of teachers. This course provides the NASUWT Health and Safety Representative with the relevant knowledge and skills to tackle the physical, environmental and organisational factors which have a detrimental effect on the health and wellbeing of members. Participants also gain an understanding of the legal duties of employers, managers and employees in respect of health and safety.

This course is in two parts over two days that are separated by several months. NASUWT Health and Safety Representatives are eligible to apply for places on these courses.

MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID - HALF DAY (ADULT)

This is a five-hour introductory mental health awareness course that covers:

- what mental health is and how to challenge stigma;
- a basic knowledge of some common mental health issues;
- an introduction to looking after your own mental health and maintaining wellbeing;
- confidence to support someone in distress or who may be experiencing a mental health issue.

This course is suitable for all members and will qualify attendees as MENTAL HEALTH AWARE.

MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID – TWO DAY (ADULT)

A practical course for an employee to become a Mental Health First Aider in the workplace – spot early signs, help someone experiencing a problem, provide help on a first aid basis, help stop a mental illness from getting worse, help someone recover faster, guide someone to the right support, and reduce the stigma of mental health problems.

PLEASE NOTE that this course is not suitable for supply teachers.

MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID (MHFA) - REFRESHER

Like physical first aid, MHFA England training is valid for three years. It is recommended that members who have completed a two-day Youth or Adult MHFA course attend a MHFA refresher course every three years to renew their skills, update their knowledge of mental health support, and practise applying the MHFA action plan.

The refresher course provides attendees with all the skills needed to continue their MHFA role in the workplace, safely and effectively.

Sessions look at how to motivate pupils; the appropriate use of language; understanding and defusing anger; and successfully dealing with violence. The importance of a whole-school approach is the underlying principle in this course.

MANAGING STRESS IN THE WORKPLACE

During this one-day course, attendees will be informed about NASUWT initiatives designed to recognise and control the damaging effects of workplace stress.

Attendees will learn how to address workplace stress using:

- health and safety laws including risk assessments and the Health and Safety Executive (HSE) management standards;
- equality legislation;
- the NASUWT Valued Worker Scheme;
- the NASUWT 'Wellbeing at Work' online stress survey;
- collective bargaining.

The day will end with some self-help initiatives for reducing workplace stress.

WORKING ASSERTIVELY - ONE DAY

This is a course suitable for all members. The course differs from commercially available courses in that it addresses assertiveness skills in the context of schools, colleges and trade unions. The course aims to build upon strengths and develop skills to enable confident communication as a basis for personal and professional development and leadership. This course is based on cognitive behaviour

techniques (CBT) and transactional analysis (TA), and will also help with behaviour management in the classroom. It is the beginning of a process which can have long-term benefits for the emotional health and professional skills of teachers. The course focuses on acquiring knowledge and skills, and the practical application of those skills.

WORKING ASSERTIVELY - SPLIT DAY

With the same course content as the Working Assertively (one day) course, this split-day course is delivered over two half-day sessions. Part 1 focuses on acquiring knowledge and skills, whilst Part 2 focuses on the application of those skills. The gap between the two course parts allows for reflective learning and enables the sharing of experiences between attendees to help deepen their knowledge and understanding.

Members must complete both parts in order to gain the full benefit of the training.
