Following a successful industrial action ballot, the NASUWT enters action short of strike action and targeted strike action focused on issues relating to pay, pensions, workload and job loss.

The NASUWT publishes Taking Control of your Performance Management and holds seminars up and down the country to support members.

The NASUWT secures the three workload reports from the Government. The NASUWT wins a legal challenge over unlawful deductions from sixth-form teachers' pay.
