'Championing the rights of disabled teachers through changing times'







The NASUWT is proud of its commitment to disability equality for all members in schools and colleges across the UK.

Trade unions have played a big part in the progress made in improving the lives of Britain's eleven million disabled people, particularly in the area of employment. Attacks on the lives and living standards of disabled people and the associated propaganda to justify them have reinforced prejudice and discrimination against disabled people.

This declaration sets out the concerns of the 2019 NASUWT Disabled Teachers' Conference and issues for action by government and other agencies across the UK. The Disabled Teachers' Consultation Conference 2019, celebrating disabled teachers and school leaders from across the UK, was a resounding success. With over a hundred attendees, the Conference radiated a vibe of positivity.

The NASUWT learnt that disabled teachers are still facing a disproportionate amount of stress in the workplace and that this is impacting negatively on their physical and mental health.
