**Getting ready for GDPR, Reducing Teacher Workload and a new approach to Supply Teachers**

On 25 May 2018, the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) will replace current UK data protection law.

Despite Brexit, this new law is happening and will radically affect all organisations that handle personal data, including schools.

The sheer scope of the changes and potentially eye-watering financial penalties may mean significant resource implications for schools.

The NASUWT 'Getting Ready for GDPR' Seminar will give you the guidance and knowledge you need to prepare you and your school for GDPR by 25 May 2018.

The Seminar will cover what is changing (and what is not) and what you should be doing now to prepare.

## DfE Workload Reducing Teacher Workload events


The Department for Education (DfE) has organised a series of regional events for school leaders and governors on workload issues. The seminars are intended to highlight strategies the schools, local authorities and multi-academy trusts can adopt to address excessive and unnecessary workload burdens in schools.

The DfE states that the events will focus particularly on the Reports of the Independent Teacher Workload Group on marking, planning and assessment.

## Supply Register

Supply teachers play a vital role in ensuring the highest standards of education for all children and young people. However, the way in which the supply agency market has operated has often been to the detriment of schools and supply teachers.

The new partnership aims to deliver a positive change for the benefit of supply teachers and schools.



The NASUWT is committed to ending the cycle where supply teachers get less, schools pay more and supply agencies make excessive profits.

The NASUWT – the Teachers' Union – and The Supply Register teaching agency have announced a new partnership in a Memorandum of Understanding to promote an ethical alternative for the employment of supply teachers.

The Supply Register approach to pay would see supply teachers guaranteed pay of no less than 80% via their chosen agency panel, 90% for day-to-day assignments via The Supply Register and 100% for medium to long-term assignments via The Supply Register. The daily rates above are based on the current supply teacher daily rates published annually by the NASUWT. The NASUWT has worked with The Supply Register to develop an offer for teachers and schools which meets the NASUWT's minimum expectations:

- supply teachers employed through The Supply Register are guaranteed to be paid an agreed national daily rate;
- supply teachers can also expect to access pay progression up to Upper Pay Scale 1 (UPS1) within six years of working with The Supply Register;
- The Supply Register and the NASUWT are committed to working together to secure access to the Teachers' Pension Scheme;
- The Supply Register will develop free continuing professional development (CPD) opportunities for all supply teachers working through The Supply Register;
- reduction of the typical charge to schools from £55 per day by an agency to just £12 per day per booking.
