

10 GOOD REASONS TO TAKE

STRIKE ACTION

1

0% for teachers for 2015-16 is unacceptable. Funding for 1% for teachers' pay for 2015-16 was provided by the Westminster Treasury in the Northern Ireland block grant.

2

Teachers in England, Wales and Scotland all received a minimum of 1% for 2015-16.

3

Teachers have already lost thousands of pounds as a result of year-on-year pay cuts since 2011. For example, a teacher on M1 has lost £15,049, a teacher on M6 has lost £23,527, and a teacher on UPS3 has lost £28,367.

Teachers are already struggling to make ends meet. Evidence shows over 50% are cutting back on essential household expenditure. 0% will exacerbate this.

5

Not only have the Employers offered 0%, but they also continue to press for restrictions on teachers' incremental pay progression.

6

0% will have a further adverse impact on the value of teachers' pensions.

7

Children and young people are entitled to be taught by those who are recognised and rewarded as highly skilled professionals.

Teachers provide a vital public service critical to the life chances of children and young people and to the economic future of the country.

Despite being presented with clear evidence, Ministers and Employers have done nothing to address excessive workload and the stress under which teachers are working.

Unless teachers make clear that 0% is the final straw, Ministers and Employers will continue to attack pay and conditions of service. Only moving to strike action will do this.



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
